## Are Pets Part of the Family?

An Italian dog owner who wanted paid time off to care for one of her dogs offered her bosses a simple explanation: "They are my family." It worked. The woman's employers changed their mind and gave the woman leave to care for her sick 12-year old English setter.

The woman is an employee at Sapienza University in Rome, whose name is Anna. She lives alone and had to take off work to bring her dog to the veterinarian for surgery. "I had asked for the paid allowance, honestly explaining what I needed it for - namely to care for my sick dog," Anna told the Turin newspaper La Stampa. "I later realized that they had counted those days as a holiday, and I got angry as a matter of principle."

An animal advocacy group, Lega Anti Vivisezione, helped Anna make her case to her employer and the university eventually agreed to grant two days of paid leave. "The lady had no help to transport and assist the dog," the group said.

Lega Anti Vivisezione argued that owners who fail to take proper care of a pet could find themselves vulnerable to legal action, because it would amount to the mistreatment or abandonment of the animal, a crime under Italian law.

Anna has two dogs, according to the Italian media: Cucciola, 12, and Duke, 17. She told La Stampa that they were part of her family and that the government should do even more to help pet owners. "I think there should be more support for those who have animals, starting for example with public vet health care," Anna said.
