<u>University volunteer TERMS OF REFERENCE: ToR 1</u>

Preamble:

The United Nations Volunteers (UNV) programme is the UN organization that promotes volunteerism to support peace and development worldwide. Volunteerism can transform the pace and nature of development, and it benefits both society at large and the individual volunteer. UNV contributes to peace and development by advocating for volunteerism globally, encouraging partners to integrate volunteerism into development programming, and mobilizing volunteers.

In most cultures volunteerism is deeply embedded in long-established, ancient traditions of sharing and support within the communities. In this context, University volunteers take part in various forms of volunteerism and play a role in development and peace together with co-workers, host agencies and local communities.

In all assignments, University volunteers promote volunteerism through their action and conduct. Engaging in volunteer activity can effectively and positively enrich their understanding of local and social realities, as well as create a bridge between themselves and the people in their host community. This will make the time they spend as University volunteers even more rewarding and productive.

- **7. Brief Project Description:** UNEP is supporting the implementation of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (DESD), 2005 -14. As part of the efforts in the Asia-Pacific region, a joint institute has been set up at Tongji University in Shanghai. Regular activities related to education (curriculum), outreach (leadership programmes) and research are conducted at this joint institute, in partnership with other UN agencies such as UNESCO and UNU. The ESD group works with different colleagues based in the region, who works across diverse areas in the environment ranging from climate change, biodiversity, marine conservation to ozone layer protection.

9. Organizational Context:

Year of establishment: 1972

Size of organization: Annual budget of over US\$30 Million in voluntary environment fund contributions, and close to US\$250 Million in trust fund and counterpart contributions, including resources through the Global Environment Facility (GEF).

Number of staff: Around 500 professional staff worldwide, with around 50 staff at the UNEP Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific in Bangkok

Other pertinent information: UNEP has six regional offices all over the globe. The Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific (ROAP) covers over 40 countries, and delivers its activities on a sub-regional basis comprising 5 distinct sub-regions: Central Asia, South Asia, Southeast Asia, Northeast Asia, and the South Pacific. UNEP's focus areas include Climate Change, Disasters and Conflicts, Ecosystem Management, Environmental Governance, Resource Efficiency, and Toxic and Hazardous Wastes. Civil society engagement and strengthening of the environmental community is a key strategic direction for UNEP in the Asia Pacific region. UNEP has partnerships with governments, international organizations, NGOs, civil

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12. Qualifications/Requirements:

- **Education:** Final year in MA study programme, preferably in Environmental Studies, Political Science, or related media, arts and science fields
- Language: Fluency of English is required
- Specific skills in requested area (e.g. related to education, health, environment or ICT4D):
 Strong knowledge and interest in environmental issues, especially, environmental education. Work experience in preparing and organizing international forums or conferences on environment is desirable.
- Computer/software skills: Proficiency in Microsoft Office
- Additional skills: Strong oral and written communication skills in English. Any experience in the Asia Pacific region would be helpful, though not mandatory

13. Other information:

A) Visa

According to our information:

- Student Volunteer submits passport details or (scanned) copy of passport to UNDP
- UNDP obtains the 'ED' type (education visa) from MOF for Student Volunteer to pick up in her/his home country. The visa for valid 90 days.
- When Student Volunteer arrives in the country, (s)he reports to UNDP visa unit.
- For 1st extension Student Volunteer has to go immigration (payment 1900 baht; valid 1-2 months)
- The 2nd extension can be done by someone else (payment 1900 baht; valid 1-2 months)
