9.1. Other information about the subject

Due to low demand in semesters 5th and 7th, Inglés Nivel Avanzado will be offered only in the 6th and 8th semesters, starting Spring Semester 2021.

This course will evaluate transferable skill CB04 (100%): Communication in English (Comunicación en Lengua Inglesa). Associated activities are described in the Schedule. Assessment activities will be both reading and listening exercises, as well as grammar tests. Due to the outbreak of Covid-19 and to help ensure continuity in education and training activities, the course will remain online. This situation will hopefully change in the near future provided the pandemic is no longer a threat.

The deadline to apply for Continuous or Final Test assessment will be on the last day of the semester starting month and students are expected to choose one before that period expires.
