#### 9. Other information

#### 9.1. Other information about the subject

Due to low demand in semesters 5th and 7th, Inglés Nivel Avanzado will be offered only in the 6th and 8th semesters, starting Spring Semester 2021.

This course will evaluate transferable skill CB04 (100%): Communication in English (Comunicación en Lengua Inglesa). Associated activities are described in the Schedule. Assessment activities will be both reading and listening exercises, as well as grammar tests. For the Second Semester, and provided that the situation due to the COVID -19 pandemic improves, the course will use a b-learning approach and so activities have been designed to fit both face-to-face and online teaching situations.

The deadline to apply for Continuous or Final Test assessment will be on the last day of the semester starting month and students are expected to choose either one or the other before that period expires.

The course will be using Blackboard Collaborate (Moodle) for online sessions and communication with the teacher will be via email (answers within the week).

\*In anticipation of possible recurrences of the COVID-19 pandemic, all the training activities initially planned as face-to-face activities, are designed to be developed through online platforms if needed for health protection reasons.
